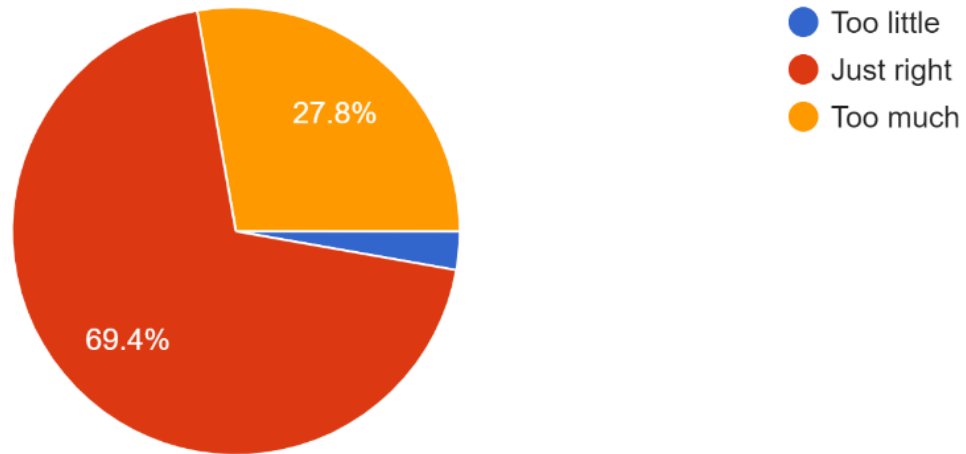

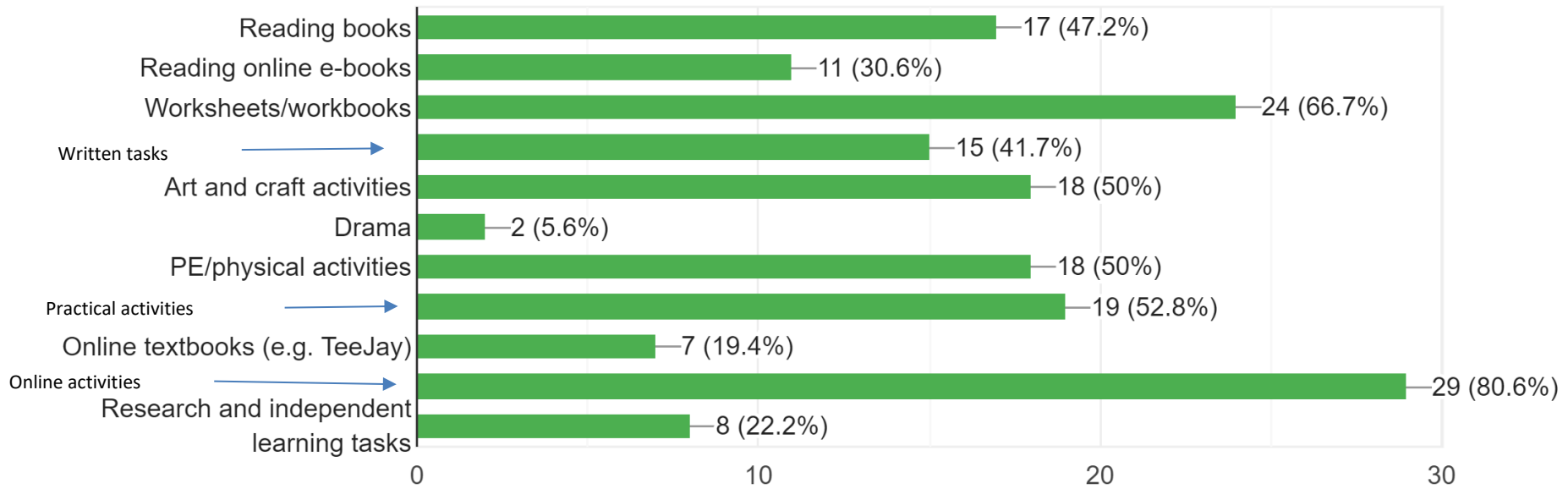
How have you found the amount of work that has been set by your child's teacher?

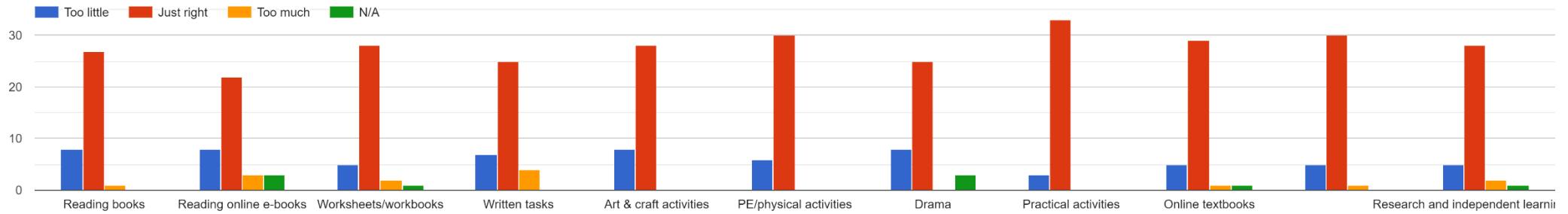


Which types of tasks has your child/children engaged with during remote learning?

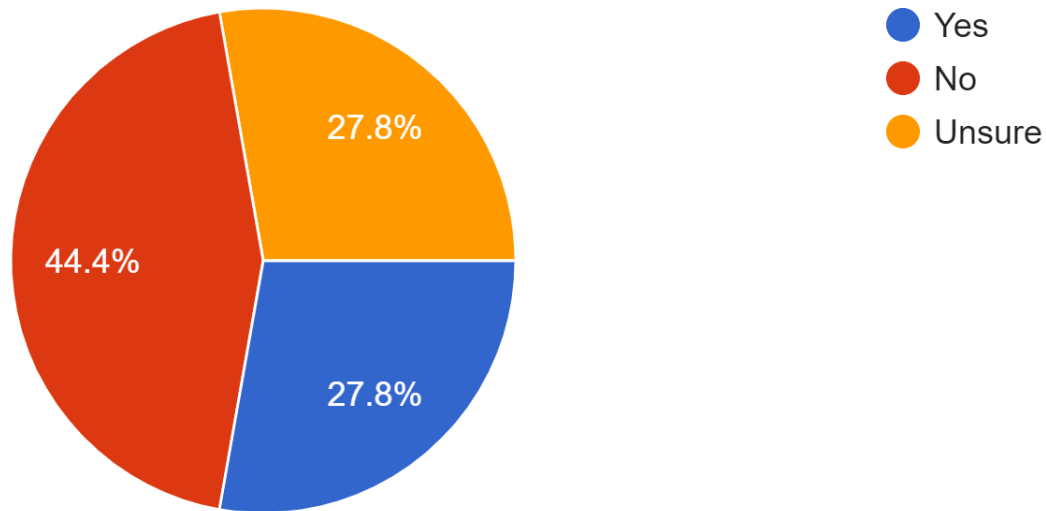


How do you feel about the amount of time spent on each of the activities?



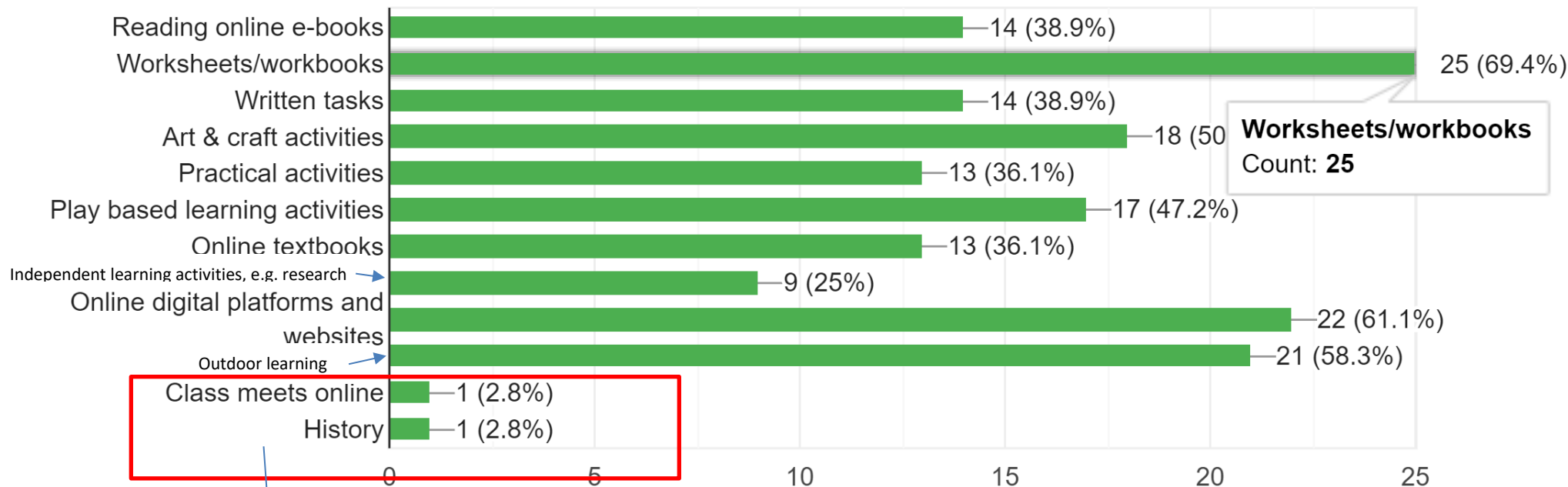
Do you plan to have your child accessing childcare or hubs on days not in school?
