### Going well

- Attitudes to school by children and young people are generally positive
- Positive about their neighbourhoods, feel safe in the place they live in always or most of the time and felt it was a good place to live
- Social well-being appears good in Perth and Kinross, with positive responses about peer relationships and general levels of self-confidence
- Majority of respondents exercise regularly and report that they are in good health
- Incidence of smoking is reducing, reported alcohol consumption remains a concern
- % of 15 year olds that had had sexual intercourse is lower than previous surveys
