St Dominic's RCPS has a Playground Charter in place, as there are lots of factors to consider in the playground; the weather conditions which can make the grass, gravel and concrete unsafe for running, the low fence and dangers certain ball games create to pedestrians and vehicles, the volume of children in a condensed space, as well supporting children with different interests and/or needs.  Staff have been very generous sharing their personal unpaid time in supporting and/or facilitating lunchtime clubs. The children have recently been provided with their own class colour coded equipment in the front playground, to support various interests.  It is our responsibility as Duty Bearers to keep the children safe and prepare them for life beyond school. Ultimately the charter and behaviour policy simply encourages the children to show kindness to eachother and respect for the equipment to help its longevity.
